TIPS FOR SELF-TAPES

1. Frame the talent from head to toe. Start off with an introduction (slate) looking into the camera (more information on what we need for your slate are on the cover page below on page four)
2. Zoom in so that the talent is framed from the top of the head to the mid-chest area ONLY, and keep that frame for the whole audition. There should be little to no space over the top of the talents head. Be sure that the lighting is bright. Make sure that the sound quality is clear. It is very important that we can clearly see and hear you!
3. Now, do the scene(s)! (scene(s) are attached at the bottom of this audition package)
 - Make sure to have a reader (this person reads all the other lines that are not the lines of the role you're auditioning for)
 - DO NOT have the reader read aloud any of the stage directions. The reader only reads the lines for the other role(s).
 - Reminder to look natural, be energetic, have fun, and just be yourself!
 - Make sure the slate and the audition scenes are TWO SEPARATE videos
4. Feel free to tape the scene's as many times as you'd like, but only send us **one** take, the BEST take for the final submission.

NOTE: Please refer to the cover page on page 4 that notes everything we need

 - Audition videos should be sent via a link such as [GoogleDriveorVimeo](#).
 - Please make sure to set the privacy settings so that the video(s) are **UNLISTED**. Auditions must not be made public. Auditions must also **NOT BE LISTED AS PRIVATE**. If you send us a private link we will be emailing you to change it to unlisted.

AUDITION NOTES FOR TALENT SENDING IN A SELF-TAPE:

SLATE:

- Please tell us your name, age, date of birth, height, (feet and inches), and location.
- In your slate please let us know what you'd like to be when you grow up!
- We are also curious if you are good at solving mysteries and if so, how do you solve them? Let us know! **Please keep your slate to under 2 minutes.**

SIDES:

- The sides materials can be found below. Please be sure you have a reader off camera doing the lines for the other character you are not auditioning for.

INT. SAGE'S DETECTIVE OFFICE - DAY

CHAT SCREEN: **DETECTIVE SAGE** (9, serious) sits into frame.

STAER SC. 1



SAGE

Any calls yet, Detective Chase?

INT. CHASE'S DETECTIVE OFFICE - DAY

SPLITSCREEN: **DETECTIVE CHASE**, (9, less serious), slides in on a chair but then accidentally keeps going and --

CHASE

Not yet, Detective Sageeeeeee.

-- slides out of view. There's an <O.S BUMP>. Chase slides in, back to camera then turns around. Sage smiles.

SAGE

Over-greased the wheels again, huh?

CHASE

I just gave the chair a full tune up. And hoo I am hungry! So, guess what it's time for? A... A... A....
(leans closer and closer)
You're not going to say it are you?

Sage gives a head shake. Chase spins the chair, undeterred.

CHASE (CONT'D)

COOKIE BREAK! It's gonna be **sweet**.

Chase holds up a massive CHOCOLATE CHIP COOKIE and takes a bite but immediately regrets it. It's gross.

CHASE (CONT'D)

Not **sweet**, not even sour! BLEGH. Oh no, do I not like cookies anymore??

SAGE

That's so weird. The baker always makes the best treats. Wait. Do you think this is a-

Sage's interrupted by a "BAKER CALLING" ICON and a <RINGING>.

CHASE

(mouth full, muffled)
-Word Mystery?

SAGE

Huh? I didn't get that.

CHASE
(swallows, then clearer)
Word mystery? Yes!

← END SC. 1

Chase accepts the call. INTERCUT WITH:

INT. BAKERY - DAY

SPLITSCREEN: Sage, Chase and the upset and pompous **BAKER**.

START SC. 2

→ BAKER
They were here, now they're gone.

SAGE
What's gone? We're Word Detectives,
not mind-readers. But that *would*
make our job easier...

CHASE
Guess what I'm thinking right now?!

BAKER
My **delicious** donuts are gone!

CHASE
<GASP> I *was* thinking about donuts!
But they were riding horses. And
fighting wingless dragons.

Sage smiles, only slightly, as the Baker shares a social
media post of **DONUTS** spelling **DELICIOUS**.

BAKER
See. I posted photos. Before.

The Baker shares a post of the same spot, now with no donuts.

BAKER (CONT'D)
And after. <CRYING> I miss them.

SAGE
Delicious means "having a very
pleasant taste or smell".

BAKER
My donuts aren't just delicious,
they're also **delightful** and **yummy**!

SAGE
Those words mean the same thing.
They're synonyms. Like, Chase would
love to say 'my cookie is
delicious, delightful, *and* yummy'.

CHASE

'In my tummy.' But I can't. Because it's not.

BAKER PHONE POV: shows all the treats with bite marks.

BAKER

But it's not just the cookies. It's the cupcakes! The pies. Even the gingerbread people.

SAGE

<GASP> The gingerbread people?!? What about their houses?!

The baker's surprised by Sage's passion. Chase explains.

CHASE

Sage really likes gingerbread.

BAKER

Yes. The gingerbread houses too.

SAGE

We can't let gingerbread taste like-

Interrupting, Chase takes a bite of cookie and regrets it.

CHASE

I'm gonna say... old shoe? Naw.

(takes another bite)

Boot? Naw.

(takes another bite)

Why am I doing this?

BAKER

I don't know. But everything here that is usually **delicious**... Isn't.

SAGE

(Clint Eastwood-esque)

We've got ourselves a Word Mystery: **delicious** is missing. Let's make things right and find it.

CHASE

And fix my cookie.

SAGE

And don't forget the gingerbread.
